

## VISITOR EXPORT CONTROL COMPLIANCE QUESTIONNAIRE

The following information is needed to determine your export control status under U.S. law. U.S. laws and regulations prohibit the unauthorized export of restricted technology to "Foreign Persons" (2 CFR 120.16). Triumph Composite Systems, Inc., in order to comply with these legal requirements, must ascertain whether someone who may be given access to restricted technology is a "Foreign Person" and would thus be subject to export control restrictions (i.e. the need for TCS to obtain an export license before granting you access to restricted technology). Certain categories of persons, known as "U.S. Persons" (22 CRF 120.15) are not considered "Foreign Persons", and therefore do not need to be granted an export license before being given access to restricted technology. The information you provide below will be used to determine whether you are a "U.S. Persons" or a "Foreign Person", as defined by federal export law(s).

## Do you belong to any of the following groups?

- 1) A citizen or national of the United States.
- 2) An alien lawfully admitted for permanent residence in the United States (i.e. a "green card" holder or a legal permanent resident alien).
- 3) An alien admitted to the United States as a refugee.
- 4) An alien granted asylum in the United States.
- 5) A person granted the status of an alien lawfully admitted for temporary residence in the U.S. as (i) a Special Agricultural Worker or (ii) an Amnesty Applicant (a special program for persons who entered the United States before January 1, 1982, and have continuously resided in the U.S. in an unlawful status since that time, and meet certain special filing requirements).
