Afghan refugees find 'peace and hope' resettling in US

More than 76,000 Afghans were evacuated to the U.S. since last summer.



Tens of thousands of Afghans have resettled across the U.S. Now, the challenge is making a home


Top States for Afghan Resettlement Since 2001, over 80% of all Afghan refugee and SIV recipients were resettled in just 10 states. While the most Afghan arrivals overall came in 2017, the number for refugees in particular was highest in 2001, when the war began.
