



Excited by what they saw, the team decided to help in a big way. They met with the House team and together, they came up with a plan—a plan to support the families through a supply drive.






Robyn, an organized friend, secured specific dates for a supply drive. Everyone was thrilled and ready to gather supplies.






Krísta and Laura found places all around the Spokane area where people could donate, líke Windermere offices, the KHQ television station, and the Spokane County Veterans Service Center.






Michael worked with the Ronald McDonald House to create marketing and communication materials, along with a plan for how to share the news with everyone.






Meanwhile, Laura worked her magic and got KHQ to spread the word. On TV, they talked about the supply drive, and the community got excited to help!










